








KNOW YOUR MITES

Two-spotted spider mite <i>Tetranychus urticae</i>		Peppers, tomatoes, cannabis, strawberries, cucurbits and other vegetables, ornamentals, flowers and fruit trees.	BioPersimilis BioSwirski BioCalifornicus BioAndersoni
European Red mite <i>Panonychus ulmi</i>		Grapes, deciduous trees, citrus, roses, ornamentals	BioCalifornicus
Citrus red mite <i>Panonychus citri</i>		Citrus but may infest pear and almond trees, roses and other broad-leaved ornamentals.	BioCalifornicus
Avocado red mite <i>Oligonychus yothersi</i>		Avocados and citrus	BioCalifornicus
Brown mites <i>Bryobia rubrioculus</i>		Fruit trees (apple, cherry, plum and almond)	BioCalifornicus
False red mite <i>Brevipalpus phoenicis</i>		Citrus, table grapes, vineyards and kiwi	BioCalifornicus BioSwirski
Broad mite <i>Polyphagotarsonemus latus</i>		Grapes, cannabis, eggplant sweet pepper, chili pepper, cucumber and ornamentals	BioCalifornicus BioCucumeris BioSwirski
